The culture of the Celts is alive in Albuquerque as evidenced by annual events such as the Rio Grande Celtic Games, the Rio Rancho Highland Games, and annual St. Patrick's Day celebrations. Albuquerque has a multitude of heritages woven into its musical fabric. The Celtic Coyotes help to keep alive the thread of Celtic music in their performances.

The group currently has 5 members; instruments include fiddle, whistles, wooden flute, small pipes, concertina, percussion, guitar and keyboards. **Stephen Miller**, songwriter and guitarist, and keyboardist **Nancy Kolenc** are the featured vocalists. **Ginger Lawrence** plays the all-important fiddle and sings. **Doug Cowan** performs on the wind instruments and manages the band. **Roger Hailstone** beats a variety of drums, including the bodhran, giving the band a unique percussive sound.

The Celtic Coyotes have been regulars at the Blue Dragon Coffee House and the Sunport Serenade Series at the Albuquerque International Airport, and have also performed at fundraisers for Habitat for Humanity, Brother Matthias and the Irish American Society. The beauty and love of Celtic music is the bond that continues to keep the Celtic Coyotes together.
